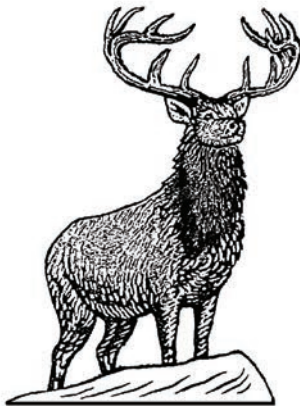

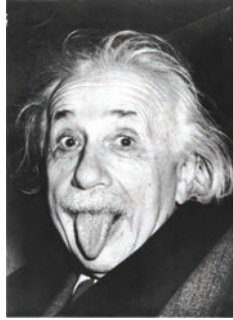

Lodge Renovation

In April the Membership tasked the Trustees with investigating the cost of a major renovation to our Lodge building. The following Statement of Work was developed:

Relocate the Lounge facilities to the upper floor, relocate the rental hall to the lower floor; Add an outdoor deck to the side of the building facing Antler Park and create an egress from the upper floor to the deck. Enclose the existing rear second stairway within the within the existing wood frame building.

Over the past four months the Trustees engaged several Architects and had meetings with Milford Bank. At the August 18th meeting the Trustees presented the results of their efforts.

At the October 6th meeting the Lodge membership will decide what course of action is to be taken.

1. To continue with the project and if so 2. Select an architect to develop a plan for bidding purposes. Information concerning the analysis will be available at the meeting. Please join us for this important meeting about the future of our Lodge.
